



Multnomah Hot Rod Council Scholarship Instructions

Founded in 1956, The Multnomah Hot Rod Council is a non-profit organization currently working on our 501c3 designation. Based in Portland Oregon, we consist of car clubs in northwest Oregon and southwest Washington. We also produce one of the largest and best roadster shows in the country.

I. AWARD DESCRIPTION

- The number and monetary value of scholarships, will be at the discretion of the Executive Board.
- The Executive Board will select the recipients of each scholarship
- The scholarship is renewable; however it must be applied for each semester or year as applicable.

II. APPLICANT'S/RECIPIENTS REQUIREMENTS

- Recipient must register in an automotive related program of study in a recognized/certified school.
- In addition to the applicant's high school grade point average (GPA), the Executive Board will preferentially consider the following.
 - Study in an automotive or technical field. To include, but not limited to, auto mechanics and autobody work.
 - Study at a vocational or technical school, two or four year college.
- Recipient must have graduated from a high school in Oregon or Washington, or have been enrolled for a least one year in the college/technical school where they are currently enrolled.

III. PAYMENT AND PUBLICITY

- Scholarship selection will be announced at the next regular MHRC meeting. Recipient will allow the MHRC to use their name and image in any publicity announcing the scholarship or promoting the program.
- The MHRC will issue a check for the scholarship amount, to the institution in the name of the recipient as soon as he/she provides proof of registration at the school, and a letter from the registrar including the recipients registration number.

IV. REQUIRED ATTACHMENTS

- MHRC Scholarship Application Form
- Scholarship Application Questionnaire
- A transcript of grades from the high school granting the diploma, or a transcript of grades verifying the attendance at a post-secondary institution
- A resume of employment history, activities, and community service
- A letter of recommendation: At least one from a high school teacher or someone from an automotive related business or field. Letters from relatives will not be accepted.
- A personal statement explaining your reason for applying for this scholarship. Please include information that will reflect some of your personal history, your future career aspirations, and your professional dreams.
