A Year in Review 2012 Multnomah Hot Rod Council President – Mike Itel



As 2012 comes to a conclusion, it's always good to take a brief look back at the year's events, accomplishments, and re-explore the mission of the

MHRC.

The first event of 2012 was one of the best Portland Roadster Shows in recent memory, with over 30,000 in attendance. There were a number of memorable moments, but none better than the King of Kustoms, George Barris declaring the PRS as better than the Grand National Show. The Hall of Fame inducted two individuals, Larry Maynard and Steve Frisbie as honorary members, and two vehicles, the 1940 Ford Custom Coupe owned by Doug Beattie, and Gary Thompson's 1969 GTX Show Car. A special "Rising Star" Award was presented to Brenden Adams by George Barris, John D'Agostino, Gene Winfield and Darryl Starbird. A very special "Thank You" to Show Director Duane Caseday, for his continued dedication to the PRS.

The cruise season kicked-off with the 16th Annual Portland Transmission Show, which drew over a record 1000 cars. Thanks to Beaches for providing hot dogs to all in attendance. Next up was the Jim Dandy's Cruise-In, hosted by the Road Knights, with over 130 cars in attendance. Special thanks to Bob & Marlene Miller, and Jan Gaddis for the fantastic show and raffle prizes.

Next up was the Seaside Muscle and Chrome Show on June 15th & 16th, where the MHRC had a booth graced by Miss Oregon 2011, Caroline McGown. On that same weekend, Duane Caseday represented us at the Rose City Round-up at Jubitz, which had over 525 vehicles in attendance. Also in June, the MHRC was

proud to present Eagan Deeks, with a check to help with his tuition in the Mt. Hood Community College Automotive program.

We next attended the Washington State Hot Rod Hall of Fame event in Everett. This was an absolutely amazing event, which opened our eyes as to how we can enhance the PRS Hall of Fame, and further develop it into a proud part of the heritage of the MHRC and the Portland Roadster Show.

In June, our two great weekly events kicked off with the first night of Beaches at PIR seeing 1350 vehicles. The Pharaohs Street Rodders also kicked off their Endless Summer Cruise-In's at Billy Bob's in historic downtown Gresham. Later in the season, the MHRC was the feature club at Beaches, with Miss Oregon Nichole Mead in attendance and seeing another record setting night. Nichole also was on hand when during one of the Pharaoh's weekly events, they presented the Missing in America Project with a check for over \$2500, which were their entire net proceeds of their 3rd Annual McKee Memorial Cruise-In for the MIAP.

On June 27th, Jodi Ross, Vance Morris, my wife Anne and I, attended the Miss Oregon Pageant, where Nichole Mead was crowned Miss Oregon 2012. Nichole's platform is supporting Veteran's causes, which aligns well with the MHRC and many of its member clubs.

Another significant event for the year was "Making Wishes Come True", in which the MHRC made it possible for Brenden Adams to take a trip to California to meet his idol Chip Foose, and take tours of the Peterson Museum and Jay Leno's Garage.

The new and what will now be an annual Hall of Fame Dinner, was a success. A special "thanks" to Jodi Ross for chairing the event, and to all who helped her to

make the event special. We had 85 in attendance, where we formally recognized our 2012 inductees Larry Maynard, Steve Frisbie, the 1940 Ford Custom of Doug Beattie, Gary Thompson's 1969 GTX Show Car, and presented them with their red Hall of Fame jackets.

Another very important event, was out trip to the SEMA show in Las Vegas in October. This year accompanied by Duane Caseday, Don Brown, and David Jothen, we had one of more successful trips, in regards to identifying and speaking to sponsors for our upcoming Portland Roadster Show, as well as future shows.

This very full and successful year closed out with our 2012 MHRC Toy Run to Randall Children's Hospital at Legacy/ Emanuel on December 8th. With approximately 125 vehicles making the run, we delivered an estimated 2000 toys for the kids.

These are just a few of the MHRC highlights of 2012. There were many more events sponsored by MHRC clubs to help charities and others. The MHRC is made up of clubs that promote the automotive hobby, and always provide a helping hand to so many. I am proud to be a member of and the President of the Multnomah Hot Rod Council.
